These are teams which play in the Idaho Youth Soccer Association (IYSA) District 3 League. We have some openings in our teams so we are looking for committed players with a passion for this game.

CLUB INFORMATION

Besides the information about these tryouts, the document in your hands contain summarized information about our programs, and cost. TRYOUTS MECHANICS

During the 1.25 hour sessions on Monday 7th, Wednesday 9th, and Friday 11th, we will mainly be working on dribbling, 1v1 situations, shooting, and 3v3 games with players. This allows us to assess some basic but fundamental technical and tactical aspects on the prospective players. Current players who already have a spot in the team will be participating in these sessions as well.

Tryouts can be stressful but we will try to have a fun time with everybody. Our schedule is very tight during these sessions, so we may not have time to speak with you about the results right away. However, we will call you within 24 hours of the specific tryout day you participated in to discuss our assessment and whether your child will be offered a spot in one of our teams or we would like her/him to attend another session this week.

OFFERING ROSTER POSITIONS

During this tryout period, we will be able to make offers for roster positions.

If we offer you a spot the week of tryouts, you can complete our registration and commitment forms, but your papers will not be binding until Monday, June 14th since per IYSA rules registrations become official starting that day.

CLUB REGISTRATION NIGHT & UNIFORM SIZING

On Monday, June 14th, we will be finalizing all registration, and collecting any missing papers and registration fees. New players will be able to try-on a uniform sample to fill in their uniform order form and any additional optional apparel.

TRYOUTS/REGISTRATION FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



1. WHERE CAN I FIND INFORMATION ABOUT REAL BOISE CF?

In this handout you will find the following information:

- Program Cost Summary
- Club Program Levels and Cost Comparison Chart

For complete information including all cost details, please download our CLUB BOOKLET from our web site. There may be some hardcopies of this booklet available at the registration table.

2. CAN I SIGN THIS WEEK IF I AM OFFERED A SPOT?

Yes, you can. A “Registration Packet” containing all the forms needed is available to you at your age group check-in table. However, the documents you sign will be not be binding until Monday, June 14th.

Returning players can also sign this week to secure their spot.

3. WHAT FORMS DO I NEED TO FILL?

You will need to fill in the following:

- Tournament Commitment Form (only for certain teams)
- Financial Agreement Form
- Player Registration and Yearly Commitment Form
- Medical Release Form

- NEW PLAYERS: Uniform Ordering form. Uniform sizing will be done on Monday, June 14th at Joplin Elementary 5:30 – 8:00 PM during our “Club Registration Night” That day your child can try on uniform samples, so do not worry about it this week.
- Optional Apparel Form (available on Monday, June 14th)
- NEW PLAYERS: A Birth Certificate will also be needed for new players on Monday June 14th (you can bring it this week too if you are offered a spot).

All these documents are available in a “Registration Packet” at the check-in table corresponding to your age group.

4. DO I HAVE TO PAY ANYTHING UPFRONT WHEN I SIGN FOR REAL BOISE CF?

- We are asking all players to pay the estimated “Team and Player Registration” Fees for the year: \$126

This includes IYSA Player/Club Registration, DIII League Team Registration, Referee Fees and Fields Usage (see COST link in our web site for complete breakdown).

- If you are a new player, you will also be paying for uniforms cost on Monday, June 14th, 2010 at the Joplin Elementary Soccer Field (club registration and uniform sizing night).
- The First payment of Club fees will be due by August 15th. Your manager will send you a bill at the beginning of August. We offer the option to pay your club fees in 8 installments!
- Scholarships are due on July 10th (please download form from our web site).
