

Scholarships and Volunteering 2010-2011



We at **Real Boise** make every effort possible to help families who need assistance with soccer expenses. As you may know and as it is specified in the club information booklet, or the packet you received at try-outs, there are four types of expenses for each team: **(1) Club Expenses, (2) Team/Player Expenses, (3) Uniform Expenses and (4) Optional Expenses.**

Optional player/team apparel: A list of optional apparel items is available in our web site. Coaches' travel expenses to out of town tournaments (accommodation and transportation).

Rent of indoor training facilities: If applicable

YMCA Low Ropes Course: \$20/player. This is an optional building camp in Spring.

Strength Equipment (new players): ~ \$90/player (yours to keep). Only players interested in doing the technical strength program (included in program). Marbles for feet strengthening work will be also needed in the program.

Strength Equipment Accessories (returning players): Returning players needing additional accessories or lost items.

Goal keeper gear: uniform and gloves.

Other Player gear: Shin guards, under armour, etc.

Additional Camps: Teams can request camps to be conducted by the club for their players.

OPTION 1 - Be part of the Real Boise Club Management Team *(Bylaws; Article XII, Section 2)*

Club Fee Benefits for Children of Real Boise Coaches
Head Coach: Full Scholarship
Assistant Coach: Full Scholarship w/D National License or equivalent, Level A or B program. <i>(2 Coaches Max)</i>
Assistant Coach: 1/2 Scholarship w/D National License or equivalent, Level C program. <i>(1 Coach Max)</i>
Assistant Coach: 1/2 Scholarship w/E License, D State or equivalent, Level A or B program. <i>(1 Coach Max)</i>
Assistant Coach: 1/4 Scholarship w/E License, D State or equivalent, Level C program. <i>(1 Coach Max)</i>
Pro-Coach or Associate Head Coach: To be studied on a case-by-case basis.

Club Fee Benefits for Children of Real Boise Team Managers, Club Managers, and Directors
Team Manager/Treasurer: Full Scholarship (up to the Level C tuition, independently of the team program)
Team Manager Only: 1/2 Scholarship (up to 1/2 the Level C tuition, independently of the team program)
Team Treasurer Only: 1/2 Scholarship (up to 1/2 the Level C tuition, independently of the team program)
Club President: Full Scholarship or corresponding pay if scholarship has been applied.
Club Treasurer: Full Scholarship or corresponding pay if scholarship has been applied.
Club Registrar: Full Scholarship or corresponding pay if scholarship has been applied.
Club Manager/Director of Operations: Full Scholarship + Pay
Director of Coaching: Full Scholarship + Pay
Assistant Director of Coaching: Full Scholarship + Pay
Technical Directors: Full Scholarship + Pay

OPTION 2 - Lead a Fundraiser Effort *(Bylaws; Article XI, Section 7)*

Team parents are encouraged to organize fundraisers to cover tournament & other costs. Our bylaws reflect a great opportunity offered to our families for earning money for soccer expenses. Ask us what fundraising opportunities we offer for the club. If you have any fundraising ideas, please submit them to the board for approval.

Club Fundraisers: 50% of club fundraiser monies raised shall be credited directly to individual team member accounts payable and the remaining 50% is donated directly to **Real Boise Soccer Club**. At the end of the season, if any positive balance exists, a check will be mailed directly to the individual team member.

Team Fundraisers: 80% of club fundraiser monies raised shall be credited directly to individual team member accounts payable and the remaining 20% is donated directly to **Real Boise Soccer Club**. At the end of the season, if any positive balance exists, a check will be mailed directly to the individual team member.

OPTION 3 – Apply for a Scholarship (Club Fees Only) *(Bylaws; Article XII, Section 1)*
